2026-2027: September–June (33-Week Program)

Welcome Parents!

We are excited to partner with you in your child's Islamic education. Our Sunday School program is designed to help children develop a strong connection with Allah, the Qur'an, and their Muslim identity through engaging, age-appropriate learning experiences.

Our Mission

To nurture young Muslims who **know Islam, love Islam, and practice Islam** by fostering faith, good character, Quran literacy, leadership, and community involvement.

Age Groups

Group A: Ages 5–6 (Early Foundations)

Students begin building their understanding of Allah, the Prophets, Islamic manners, prayer, and Arabic letters through stories, crafts, songs, and hands-on activities.

Group B: Ages 7–9 (Building Knowledge)

Students deepen their understanding of the Five Pillars, Six Articles of Faith, Quran reading, duas, and Islamic practices such as wudu, salah, Ramadan, and charity.

Group C: Ages 10–12 (Developing Understanding)

Students strengthen Quran fluency and Tajwid, explore Seerah and Islamic history, learn basic Fiqh and Aqidah, and develop leadership and service skills.
