Mission Statement

Our mission is to nurture children with the Qur'an, Islamic knowledge, and excellent character while helping them develop a lifelong love for Allah (SWT), His Messenger ﷺ, and the Muslim community.

We strive to provide a safe, welcoming, and engaging Islamic learning environment where every child can grow spiritually, socially, and academically.

Program Overview

Classes are held every Sunday from **September through June** and include:

- Qur'an Reading & Memorization
- Islamic Studies
- Arabic Language Basics
- Character Development
- Salah & Masjid Etiquette
- Special Activities and Community Events

What Students Learn

Throughout the school year, students will develop:

- Improved Qur'an reading and memorization

- Knowledge of the Seerah of Prophet Muhammad ﷺ
- Basic Arabic reading skills
- Strong Islamic manners and character
- Confidence in their Muslim identity
- Respect for parents, teachers, and the community

Attendance

Regular attendance is essential for student success.

Parents are expected to:

- Ensure students arrive on time.

- Notify the school if a student will be absent via the [QAF app](#).
- Encourage students to complete any missed assignments.

Excessive absences may affect classroom placement and academic progress.

Arrival & Dismissal

- Students should arrive **10 minutes before class begins**.
- Students should be picked up promptly after dismissal.
- Parents should notify the school if someone else will be picking up their child.
- Students may not leave the building without parent authorization.

Late Pick-Up Policy

To ensure student safety and respect the time of our teachers and volunteers:

- A **5-minute grace period** is provided.
- After the grace period, a **\$1 per minute** late fee will be charged.
- Outstanding late fees must be paid before the student's next class.

Tuition & Fees

The annual tuition covers books for the school year.

Semester Tuition

- 1 Student: \$125
- 2 Students (10% Discount): \$238
- 3 or More Students (20% Discount): \$350

Annual Tuition

- 1 Student: \$250
- 2 Students (10% Discount): \$475
- 3 or More Students (20% Discount): \$700

Refund Policy

- Tuition refunds are available only within the first 30 days of the school year.

Tuition Payment Options

Tuition may be paid using any of the following methods:

- **Online** (recommended)
- **Kiosk** (located in the mosque lobby)
- **Check** (payable to **Islamic Society of Frederick**)
- **Zelle**
- **Cash** (payable at the ISF office)

Note: For payments made by **Zelle** or **check**, please include "**Sunday School**" and the **parent or student name** so we can correctly apply your payment.

Dress Code

Students should dress modestly and respectfully while attending Sunday School.

Examples include:

- Clean, modest clothing
- No clothing with inappropriate language or graphics

- Girls are encouraged to wear hijab when appropriate for their age and family preference
- Boys should dress respectfully for the masjid environment

Student Expectations

Students are expected to:

- Demonstrate Islamic manners at all times
- Respect teachers, classmates, volunteers, and school property
- Participate actively in class
- Come prepared with required materials
- Complete homework assignments
- Listen attentively and follow classroom instructions
- Maintain proper masjid etiquette

Teacher Commitment

Our teachers are committed to:

- Teaching with kindness, patience, and professionalism
- Modeling Islamic manners and character
- Creating a safe and engaging classroom
- Monitoring each student's academic progress
- Communicating with parents throughout the school year
- Encouraging every child to reach their full potential

Behavior & Discipline

Our discipline philosophy is based on Islamic values of mercy, patience, and respect.

Behavior concerns are addressed using progressive steps:

1. Gentle reminder
2. Redirection
3. Parent communication
4. Individual behavior plan (when appropriate)
5. Administrative intervention for repeated or serious concerns

Our goal is always to help students learn and grow—not simply to punish inappropriate behavior.

Communication

Communication with parents is an important part of student success.

Parents should expect updates through:

- [QAF Parent App](#)
- Email announcements
- Parent-Teacher Conferences
- Progress Reports

Parents are encouraged to contact teachers or school administration whenever they have questions or concerns.

Health & Safety

To help keep everyone safe:

- Keep children home if they are sick.
- Inform the school of allergies, medical conditions, or medications.
- Ensure emergency contact information remains current.

- Students must remain in designated areas of the masjid unless supervised.

Technology Policy

Students should keep phones, smart watches, and other electronic devices put away during class unless instructed otherwise by their teacher.

ISF Sunday School is not responsible for lost or damaged personal electronic devices.

Lunch & Snacks

Students may bring:

- A healthy lunch or snack (if applicable)
- A refillable water bottle

Please avoid sending:

- Candy
- Soda
- Energy drinks

Parents should notify the school of any food allergies.

Classroom Materials

Students should bring:

- Notebook
- Pencil or pen
- Refillable Water bottle

- Homework or memorization assignments

Teachers may request additional materials during the school year.

Homework

Parents play an important role in reinforcing classroom learning.

We encourage parents to:

- Practice Qur'an reading with their child
- Review memorization assignments
- Help complete homework
- Reinforce Islamic manners at home

ISF Sunday School is a community-driven program that depends on the support and involvement of our parents. To help ensure a successful school year, **each family is expected to volunteer for at least one school activity during the year.**
